# **Chequamegon Bay Quilters Meeting Minutes for March 3, 2020**

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Amber) There is \$4,431 in the checking account, with \$827 specifically for Quilt of Valor (QOV membership fees have not yet been sent in). With a cushion of \$300, there is \$3303.

# <u>Unfinished objects or UFO Project</u> (Jill S.)

Jill has received a few lists of unfinished projects with photos. She is also instituting a prize at the end of the year, with a slip in the drawing for each time a member shares any type of show and tell during the year's meetings. Jan S. won the prize for this month's finished UFO (project in progress now completely finished).

# Felted Gnome Class (Jill S.)

Jill has arranged for Laura Berlage to teach a class at the Washburn Library on March 27 from 4-7 pm, if there are at least 6 who sign up.

## Raffle License (Amber)

The regular raffle license CBQ has had for the last year is due to expire. The officers (board) recommends that the license be suspended for now. No quilt show is planned so there is no immediate need for a license. If CBQ makes a quilt to donate to an organization, the organization can do its own raffle. If CBQ makes a quilt to be raffled as a fundraiser for the guild, then the license can be obtained at that time. It would only take 2-3 weeks to obtain. License is \$25.

Kaci motion, Lynn second, to suspend the raffle license. Motion passed.

#### Quilt Retreat at Harborview Event Center (Jill C.)

24 quilters attended, with 14 staying overnight. Another retreat is planned for the fall (making the retreats twice a year). Food was good. Everyone sewed a lot, including Friday night, some were sewing until 2 am. A new quilter won the fat quarter prize.

## Quilt of Valor (Jan S.)

Northern Lights (nursing home) and The Oaks (assisted living) have requested that veterans living there be given QOV quilts (16 names of which one person received a quilt before). These quilts would be given at a different time than, and be in addition to, the October "regular" QOV presentation. Could there be 15 quilts ready a year from now? By rough count, 5 or 6 are already to go. There is still considerable backlog difficulty in getting quilting done through the QOV Foundation.

Lynn motion, Jill S. second, to make and give QOV quilts to Northern Lights and The Oaks. Motion passed.

The blocks created at the QOV sew day have been given to the National Guard effort (Spooner, Hayward, Ashland). Karen suggested the use of embroidery patterns for quilting.
